U.N. Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change agenda.' He also claims he was right in 2003 when he said blaming global warming on carbon dioxide and other manmade gases is the 'greatest hoax ever perpetrated on the American people.'

Climate Depot executive editor Mark Morano comments that Inhofe's report is very comprehensive. 'Senator Inhofe has alleged criminal activity on the parties,' Morano notes. 'He's calling for the head of the U.N. to testify, [and] he's calling for Al Gore to come back and defend his climate claims. This is a huge development because this is going to turn into testimony. You're going to have congressional hearings on this, investigations. It's going to keep it in the public eye.' The journalist finds it amazing how the mighty have fallen. 'This was an insular industry that didn't answer to anyone,' he comments, 'and now they've been cracked open like an egg — and the corruption and the stench is overwhelming.'" (NOTE: In our Weekly Bulletin we have consistently maintained that "Global Warming" is a trumped up "cry wolf" global hoax, with no scientific backing — Ed).

3. Interfaith Dialogue continues to spread (Friday Church News Notes, March 5, 2010)

Interfaith dialogue spreads among "evangelicals." The March 2010 edition of *Lausanne World Pulse* features an article entitled "Interfaith Interface with Buddhists" by Chandler Im. The author is director of Ethnic Ministries at the Billy Graham Center at Wheaton College and professor of missions at Faith Evangelical Seminary in Tacoma, Washington. Chandler Im favorably quotes Lesslie Newbigin, saying, "I strongly concur with Newbigin's claim that until one has felt in one's soul the dynamic power and influence of a great religion, one has not heard or understood the message of it."

This is heresy. Nowhere does the Bible teach God's people to study pagan religions in order to "feel" their dynamic power. To the contrary, the Bible says that the power behind pagan

religion is the devil and warns us in strongest terms to stay away from it. "*Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel? ... Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you*" (2 Corinthians 6:14, 15, 17). Newbigin was Associate General Secretary in the radically heretical World Council of Churches. In *The Gospel in a Pluralist Society*, Newbigin denied that the Bible is the verbally inspired Word of God.

Newbigin taught that there is the possibility of salvation apart from personal faith in Christ. Modern evangelicalism is shot through and through with dangerous heretical thinking.

James 4:13-15 - *"Go to now, ye that say, Today or tomorrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that."*

In the past week, yet another major crisis has struck the global air travel industry. In countries all around the world, people's travel plans were disrupted and thrown into disarray, all because of a volcano erupting in the distant island of Iceland. Over a hundred thousand flights have been cancelled, with millions of people stranded around the world. With total economic losses estimated to be in the region of 2 billion dollars, many reports have described this as the worst crisis for the aviation industry to date, eclipsing even the effects of the 3 day worldwide shutdown after the 9/11 terrorists attacks in 2001.

In reading these reports of such unprecedented happenings, one cannot help but remember the words of James, as he addresses all who would make such presumptuous travel arrangements without seeking God's blessings, but are instead focused on economic gain. He rebukes them directly in saying, *"go to now, ye that say, Today or tomorrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain:"*. Truly such is a mindset that we see all around us today, especially in this age where air travel is so common, and often taken for granted.

Yet in the past week, man, with all his high-tech jet engines was rendered helpless as the plumes of volcanic ash floated across Europe. As safety concerns took precedence over economic considerations, man's frailty was woefully exposed. Ironically, it took this massive vaporous cloud hanging over the skies of Europe, to illustrate the fact to man, that his own life is but like *"a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away"*.

Indeed, we really do not know what tomorrow will bring, and for it is all in the will of God. We can plan, make all the necessary arrangements, book our tickets well in advance, and buy multiple travel insurances. However, if God so chooses, he could foil any plan that man makes with a simple rumbling of the earth. In all this, we cannot help but to prostrate ourselves before our great sovereign and almighty God, who *"hath his way in the whirlwind and in the storm, and the clouds are the dust of his feet. He rebuketh the sea, and maketh it dry, and drieth up all the rivers: Bashan languisheth, and Carmel, and the flower of Lebanon languisheth. The mountains quake at him, and the hills melt, and the earth is burned at his presence, yea, the world, and all that dwell therein."* (Nah 1:3-5)

So in these happenings, what lesson can we learn? This is clearly not a call for us to stop our travels, but rather, it calls for a change of mindset. Instead of man's arrogant presumptuous confidence in himself and in his own plans, what we need is to profess our utter and complete reliance on God. Everything that we do or plan for, we do it not because of selfish wants and desires, but instead, we ought to say, only *"if the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that"*. This is the mindset of a God-fearing man who will always seek the Lord's will in anything and everything that he does. He will not travel for business or pleasure or otherwise, unless he knows that it is God's will for him to do so. As he boards the plane, he prays for God's protection, and as he lands, he thanks God for safety. He sleeps easy at night, knowing that God is in control, and thus he happily places his life in God's almighty hands.
